I am writing to you to warn you that an article has been published in the 16 November 2011 issue of Magyar Nemzet about the Parliamentarium, the European Parliament's Visitors' Centre, in which your name appeared mistakenly and in a negative light.


The author of the article objects to the usage of two photos and texts in the exhibition: a Second World War picture about Hungary, which describes Hungary as a Nazi-ally, therefore sheds an unfavourable light on Hungary; and secondly according to the author a displeasing photo of the Hungarian revolution of 1956.

The article also mentions the names of the Hungarian participants of the Academic Committee, whereby bringing them into relation with the content in question.

We would like to assure you that bringing your name in connection with the specific content of the exhibition is due to a misunderstanding. By no means do we consider you to be responsible for it, as you have not participated in the Academic Committee's meetings. The Academic Committee's purpose was to steer the content of the exhibition in its first, conceptual phase. The detailing and writing of the content was later accomplished by a subcontractor of the European Parliament.

We are very sorry that your name has been involved in this issue against our will.
